
REGULATIONS OF OLSZTYN HALF MARATHON RELAYS (HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS: EVENT")

ORGANIZER

The organizer of the event is Sport Evolution Group Sp. z o.o., located at 12/23 Jana Kochanowskiego Street, 01-864 Warsaw, registered in the National Court Register under the number 0000779253, with the registration court: District Court for the capital city of Warsaw, XIII Economic Department of the National Court Register, NIP (Tax Identification Number): 1231431002, REGON (National Business Registry Number): 382960037, **correspondence address: Falencka 1B, 05-090 Raszyn (hereinafter referred to as the "organizer").**

I. OBJECTIVE

1. Promoting running as the simplest form of exercise.
2. Promoting Olsztyn in Poland and worldwide.
3. Promoting physical activity among residents of Olsztyn and the surrounding areas.
4. Building a civic society based on the idea of volunteering.

II. DATE AND PLACE

1. The event will take place on October 3, 2026, in Olsztyn at 20:00.

III. ROUTE & TIME LIMIT.

1. Distance of the route: 21,0975 km. The route will have the approval of the Polish Athletics Association (PZLA) and will be marked every 1 km. The Organizer reserves the right to change the route and its length in justified circumstances. Such a change does not result in any additional claims or obligations.
2. The distances covered by relay team members are as follows:
 - a. First athlete: 10 km
 - b. Second athlete: 6,0975 km
 - c. Third athlete: 5 km
3. The detailed race route will be posted on the website www.olsztynhalf.pl (hereinafter referred to as the "event website"). The Organizer reserves the right to change the route and its length. Such a change does not constitute grounds for requesting a refund of the entry fee or any compensation, provided that the change is made for important organizational or safety reasons.

4. The time limit for finishing the race is 3 hours.
5. After the time limit expires, the athlete is obliged to immediately leave the race route.
6. The time limit for completing individual segments of the running competition will be published on the event's website no later than 14 days before the event.
7. Apart from the Organizer, individuals authorized by them, and public services, individuals without a race number are not allowed on the route. Individuals violating this prohibition may be removed from the race route by appropriate services.
8. As runners move, the route will be gradually closed to vehicular traffic. This closure also applies to bicycles, rollerblades, skateboards, and other mechanical devices.
9. Electronic time measurement checkpoints will be located along the race route. Bypassing a checkpoint or running on the sidewalk, lawn, or any part of the road that is not part of the race route may result in disqualification.
10. There will be three refreshment points located along the course of the event.
11. After the time limit expires, the athlete is obliged to immediately leave the race route.
12. In the event of the passage of an emergency vehicle, as defined in Article 53 of the Road Traffic Law, the Participant is strictly required to give way on the Race route. Failure to comply with this obligation may result in disqualification from the Event.
13. A person who remains on the course after the time limit does so at their own risk and loses their status as a race participant. From that moment, they are no longer covered by the Organizer's medical or technical support and are required to follow the general provisions of the Road Traffic Law, bearing full responsibility for any violations.

IV. SAFETY

1. In the interest of the safety of athletes, volunteers, and organizers during the event, all participants and spectators must adhere to the current epidemic guidelines available on the website www.gov.pl (if applicable).
2. Persons under quarantine, under epidemiological supervision, or exhibiting symptoms of infection (fever, cough, shortness of breath) are prohibited from attending the event.
3. The athletes declare awareness of the level of risk associated with being in a crowded place during the event, including the risks of viral infection.
4. The athlete declares that they will not make any claims against the organizer in the event of any infection acquired during the event.
5. By standing at the starting line, the athlete confirms that they are participating solely at their own risk. The athlete acknowledges the associated risks, understanding that participating in the event involves significant physical exertion and entails inherent risks and the possibility of accidents, potential bodily injuries, and physical harm (including death), as well as property

damage and losses. The athlete voluntarily chooses to assume these risks. The above does not exempt the organizer from liability arising from the mandatory provisions of the law. The organizer provides personal accident insurance (NNW) to athletes who have been correctly verified at the race office. Each athlete will be covered by insurance for personal accident protection, covering bodily injury or health impairment resulting in permanent disability or death of the insured, occurring during the insurer's liability period in the territory of the Republic of Poland. The premium is paid by the Policyholder, i.e., the Organizer.

6. Athletes are obliged to strictly follow the instructions of the Organizers, traffic management services, including the Police, Municipal Guard, judges, and other services securing the race route.
7. Medical service decisions regarding the continuation of the race are final and indisputable. The medical transport of an athlete results in disqualification.
8. If an athlete decides to withdraw from the race at any point in the event, they are obligated to report this fact to the judges or the organizer. Failure to report this fact to the judges or the organizer may result in the athlete being disqualified and suspended from participating in events organized by Sport Evolution Group Sp. z o.o. for 2 years.

V. PARTICIPATION

1. Persons who are at least 18 years old on the day of the event (born before October 4, 2008) are eligible to participate in the event.
2. Every athlete in the event must undergo verification at the race office. Details about the check-in at the race office can be found in Chapter X.
3. A relay team consists of three athletes, of whom:
 - a. the first athlete runs 10 km to the Transition Zone;
 - b. the second athlete runs 6.0975 km to the Transition Zone;
 - c. the third athlete runs 5 km and finishes the race at the finish line.
4. Athletes in the relay team cannot be repeated, which means the relay team must consist of three different people.
5. For safety reasons, the following are prohibited:
 - a. Bringing items onto the race course that may pose a threat to other athletes.
 - b. Participating in the event wearing an outfit that covers the face and prevents the identification of the athlete.
 - c. Starting with animals and pets.
 - d. Starting with strollers and child carriers.
6. The Organizer may prohibit participation with an item not described in point 3 of Chapter VI if it affects the safety of athletes, volunteers, and the organizer.

7. Only athletes who have been properly check-in at the race office and have a race number may be on the race route. There is no possibility of starting with a companion.
8. The athlete is responsible for covering the costs of the entry fee, accommodations, transportation, and personal meals.
9. Each Athlete must take part in the Race with the BIB number received in the race pack. If the athlete does not wear the BIB number during the run, it may lead to disqualification from the Race.
10. The change of athletes is made by a tap of the hand of the athlete starting a stage of the event by the athlete finishing in a stage of the event at a place designated by the organizer.

VI. REGISTRATION

1. Registration for the event will take place through the registration form available on the SlotMarket.pl website from March 17, 2026, to September 27, 2026, or until all slots are sold out.
2. Every person wishing to participate in the relay during the event is required to register on the SlotMarket.pl system by September, 2026
3. The team limit for the event is 10 teams. In the event of reaching the limit, the organizer reserves the right to close registrations earlier.
4. The Organizer reserves the right to invite individuals to athlete in the event after the limit is reached or after the deadline specified in point 1 of Chapter VI.
5. The Organizer reserves the right to change the participant limit, with the guarantee of athlete for everyone registered before the announcement of such a change.
6. Registration is considered successful upon submitting a correctly filled registration form and payment of the current entry fee available in the registration profile for the event on the SlotMarket.pl website.
7. Confirmation of successful registration includes:
 - a. Confirmation of event registration from the SlotMarket.pl website (confirmation from the email address contact@slotmarket.pl);
 - b. Confirmation of payment from the Przelewy24 portal;
 - c. Registration information in the Registration History on the user's SlotMarket.pl account (status: "Registered").

Information on how to register a relay team:

STAGE I (Creating a Team): The first person on the team selects the "create a new team" option, creates a name, and chooses the discipline in which they will participate. After paying the entry fee, the captain receives a token (code) and shares it with team members. Using the code, team members

must register and join the created team. **Payment by the first person does not automatically register the other athletes.**

STAGE II (Joining the Team): Participants receive a token (code) from the first person, and using this code, they register by choosing "join a team." They will be prompted to enter the code and choose the discipline in which they will participate. Participants do not pay for registration, but they must register to confirm their participation.

VII. ENTRY FEE

1. The entry fee for participating in the event, depending on the order of payment, is as follows:
 - a. First 50 teams – 300,00 PLN
 - b. Last 50 teams – 350,00 PLN
 - c. In the race office – 500,00 PLN (subject to availability)
2. The entry fee must be paid through the Przelewy24 transaction service. All data provided in payments is entered on a secure encrypted page.
3. The fee must be settled during registration; otherwise, the registration will be canceled.
4. The entry fee includes pre-race athlete support (email communication and through social media channels), maintenance of servers and the event website, purchase and rental of equipment for organizing the event, race package, organization, and promotion of the event.
5. Athletes who wish to receive an invoice for the paid entry fee should select the appropriate option in the registration form and enter the required data for issuing the document. The invoice will be generated automatically after the payment is credited and will be available for download from the participant's profile on the SlotMarket.pl website.
6. The organizer does not issue paper invoices.
7. To receive an invoice after making the payment, please contact faktry@sporevolution.pl.
8. Invoices for individuals will be issued within three months of payment.
9. Invoices for business entities will be issued by the fifteenth of the following month after the payment is made.

VIII. ADDITIONAL SERVICES

1. During registration for the Event and after its conclusion, the Athlete may purchase additional services.
2. The purchase of services is optional and not required to complete the Event. Services can be purchased up to 7 days before the Event.
3. The price for each service is listed in the registration form for the Event on the SlotMarket.pl portal.

4. Insurance policies are purchased from UNIQA via the SlotMarket.pl and UDAO portals. In this relationship, the Organizer acts as an intermediary, not the insurer.
5. The Organizer is not responsible for the quality or timeliness of the additional services. Any complaints should be directed to the service provider.
6. Fees for additional services purchased through Slotmarket.pl are refundable until August 21, 2026.
7. Purchased insurance from UNIQA is non-refundable.
8. In the case of hotel reservations made via Slotmarket.pl, the refund deadline is specified in the service description.

IX. RACE PACKAGE

1. As part of the event, each athlete receives:
 - a. 3 x BIB number / race number
 - b. 3 x Chip
 - c. 3 x Deposit bag
2. Athlete who finish the race within the time limit are entitled to a medal.
3. An athlete who transfers the race package to another person, and a person who acquires a race package without reporting this fact to the organizer, may be disqualified and suspended from participating in events organized by Sport Evolution Group sp. Z o.o. for 2 years. Additionally, a participant using another person's package will not be covered by personal accident insurance.
4. Packages not collected during the race office's working hours may be sent to the athlete upon their request via courier to the address: biuro@olsztynhalf.pl, within 7 days from the race day. Shipping costs are as follows:
 - a. Poland – 20 PLN
 - b. European Union countries – 10 EUR,
 - c. Countries outside the European Union – 50 EUR
5. The participant covers the shipping cost before the shipment is processed.

X. RACE OFFICE, START LINIE, FINISH LINE, DEPOSIT

RACE OFFICE / CHECK-IN

1. The race office will be located at Urania Hall in Olsztyn on October 3, 2026.
2. The opening hours of the race office will be published on the event's website.
3. Every team is required to check-in at the race office during its opening hours. The team captain or a team member can check-in.

4. The condition for a positive check-in is the personal appearance of the team captain or a team member and the presentation at the competition office of the registration confirmation in the form of a QR ticket, identity document or passport, and a photocopy of the identity document or passport for absent team members, along with a written authorization. The authorization will be available on the event's website 30 days before the event.
5. The QR code necessary for check-in at the race office will be provided to the athlete a maximum of 3 days before the race to the email address provided during registration and will be published on the Slotmarket.pl portal in the athlete's account.
6. The race package is issued in its entirety, and it is not possible to collect only part of the race package.
7. The opening hours and location of the Race Office may be subject to change. Such a change does not constitute grounds for requesting a refund of the entry fee or any compensation, provided that the change is made for important organizational or safety reasons. The exact opening hours and location of the Race Office will be announced on the <http://www.olsztynhalf.pl/>.

START LINE

1. The start will take place at Kościuszki Square in Gdynia at 20:30 and will be organized in waves.
2. Relays start in the first wave, together with the fastest wave of athlete in the event.
3. Athletes are required to position themselves at the start in zones designated by the organizer.
4. The nature of the start, its time, location, and wave division may be subject to change. Such a change shall not constitute grounds for requesting a refund of the entry fee or for claiming compensation or damages, provided that the change is caused by important organizational or safety reasons. Detailed information about the start location will be published on the website: <http://www.olsztynhalf.pl/>.

FINISH LINE

1. Only athletes who have crossed the finish line are allowed in the finish area. Upon crossing the finish line, the athlete will receive a commemorative medal.
2. Entering the finish area with a companion, an animal, or items that may pose a threat to the safety of the athlete or others is prohibited. Failure to comply with this rule may result in disqualification.
3. The finish line location may be subject to change. Such a change does not constitute grounds for requesting a refund of the entry fee or any compensation, provided that the change is made for important organizational or safety reasons.

DEPOSIT

1. The location and opening hours of the deposit will be provided on the event's website.

2. Items for the deposit will only be accepted in the deposit bags. Athletes must affix the race number sticker to the designated area on the bag at the assigned location.
3. There is no option to leave items in the deposit that are not placed in the deposit.
4. The organizer is not responsible for valuable items left in the deposit.

XI. TRANSFER & WITHDRAWALS

In accordance with Article 38(1)(12) of the Consumer Rights Act, the athlete is not entitled to the right of withdrawal from the agreement to participate in the race.

1. In case of withdrawal from the race, the organizer will refund a portion of the entry fee according to the following schedule:
 - a. 50% of the entry fee until July 4, 2026.
 - b. 25% of the entry fee from July 5, 2026, to August 21, 2026.
 - c. From August 22, 2026 onward, the registration fee is non-refundable.
2. There is no possibility to transfer the entry fee to another year.
3. To withdraw or request a transfer, please send an email to biuro@olsztynhalf.pl.

TRANSFER ENTRY FEE TO ANOTHER PERSON

1. The transfer of the entry fee to another person is possible until September 20, 2026.
2. Transferring the entry fee to another person is possible after paying a handling fee of PLN 15. The handling fee is paid by the person registered for the event through the Przelewy24 portal.
3. To transfer the registration to another person, log in to the account on SlotMarket.pl, where the registration was made, then go to the Registration History tab (after selecting the "Account" tab) and click the "TRANSFER" button. In the final step, provide the email address of the person to whom the participant wants to transfer, and pay the handling fee.
4. The person who received the email with the registration link is required to register for the event within two days from receiving the email with the link. To register, log in or create a new account using the same email address that was provided earlier.
5. Once the entry fee has been transferred, it is not subject to further transfers or refunds.

XII. CLASSIFICATION & RESULTS

1. The official race time is the athlete's net time. The net time will be measured from the starting line to the finish line.
2. The following categories will be conducted as part of the event:
 - a. Men's (composed of only male athletes in the team)
 - b. Women's (composed of only female athletes in the team)

- c. Mixed (composed of two males and one female in the team or two females and one male)
3. The results will be published on the event's website and provided to the media for information.
4. Winners of 1st to 3rd places will receive commemorative statuettes.
5. In the event of absence at the award ceremony, prizes can only be collected at the Organizer's headquarters within 30 days after the conclusion of the event.
6. The Organizer reserves the right to introduce additional awards in categories of their choosing.

Publication of Data and Nature of Participation

1. The public publication of results, including at least the participant's first name, last name, country, club, and age category, is an integral part of the sporting competition and represents the essence of the event. The official public results serve as the historical record of the event.
2. Each Athlete, during registration, makes a choice regarding the public disclosure of their data in the official results and the start list.
3. Athletes who consent to the publication of their data take part in the Race under standard conditions, are included in all relevant classifications (overall, age group, etc.), and are eligible to receive awards.
4. If a team member does not agree to the public sharing of their data, the team will not be included in the categories listed in point 1 of Chapter XII.
5. Teams assigned to the category referred to in point 4:
 - a. Take full part in the Race and are entitled to all Organizer's services, including time measurement.
 - b. Upon finishing the Race within the time limit, they receive a commemorative medal.
 - c. Their result (finish time) will be recorded.
 - d. They will not be classified in any category.
6. Choosing not to consent to the publication of data is equivalent to accepting the participation rules described in point 5 and constitutes a final decision to withdraw from competitive participation in favor of recreational participation.

XIII. PERSONAL DATA PROTECTION

1. The personal data of athletes is administered by Sport Evolution Group Sp. z o.o., Jana Kochanowskiego 12/23, 01-864 Warsaw, contact regarding personal data at: daneosobowe@sportevoolution.pl.
2. The personal data of athletes will be processed for the purpose of organizing and conducting the event, determining the winner, awarding, issuing, receiving, and settling the prize, as well as other activities related to the conducted business.

3. To perform time measurement, create results, send information about the start number, and the achieved result, athlete data will be provided to the company responsible for timekeeping during the event.
4. The athlete has the right to access and correct their data. Providing personal data and giving consent to their processing is voluntary but necessary to achieve the above-mentioned purposes. Failure to provide data or lack of consent to their processing prevents participation in the competition. Please note that the given consent can be revoked at any time; however, revocation does not affect the lawfulness of data processing prior to withdrawal.
5. The processing of athlete data, in connection with participation in the event, also includes the publication of the athlete's name, year of birth, club affiliation along with the name of the place of residence—in any way the project will be published.
6. All information about participants obtained by the organizer and included in the registration form will be electronically stored and used in accordance with applicable legal regulations.
7. The organizer reserves the right to conduct interviews with each participant, take photos and film them for advertising, promotional, internet, radio-television broadcast, and other commercial purposes.
8. The organizer reserves the right to use free of charge worldwide all photos, film materials, interviews, and sound recordings depicting competition participants. They may be used by the organizer by placing them on CD-ROMs, DVDs, portable devices such as pendrives or external drives, cloud services, in catalogs, and media, on websites, in newspapers, and exhibitions, as well as for promotional and advertising purposes related to the organizer's activities.
9. The data retention period is as follows:
 - a. For data processed for the purpose of pursuing potential legal claims—until the claim is time-barred or the proceedings related to pursuing claims are concluded.
 - b. For data processed to document conducted activities and inform about them—no more than 5 years from the date of the documented event, unless the data is processed for archival purposes in the public interest.
 - c. For data processed to ensure the security of networks and IT systems—no more than 5 years from the date of registration.
 - d. For data processed based on the participant's consent—until the consent is withdrawn.
10. To withdraw consent for the processing of personal data, the participant should complete the form available at <https://slotmarket.pl/document/polityka-prywatnosci> and send it to contact@slotmarket.pl.

XIV. COMPLAINTS

1. Complaints related to event matters should be submitted in writing along with a justification to the organizer's correspondence address, marked "Olsztyn Half Marathon - Complaint," within 7 days from the date of the event—either in person, by registered mail (postmark date determines), or to the email address: biuro@olsztynhalf.pl with the subject " Olsztyn Half Marathon – Complaint”.
2. Complaints submitted after the deadline specified in point 1 of Chapter XIV will not be considered.
3. The organizer will review complaints about the event within 14 days from the date of their receipt.
4. The Organizer's decision on complaints about the event will be final.
5. The above does not limit the Consumer's rights to pursue claims based on the absolutely applicable provisions of the law before the common courts.

XIV. FINAL PROVISIONS

1. This regulation applies to all participants of the event.
2. The regulation is effective from March 17, 2026.
3. Each participant in the event is obligated to familiarize themselves with the regulation.
4. Lack of knowledge of the competition regulation does not exempt the participant from the rules specified by the organizer in this regulation.
5. In case of non-compliance with any point of the regulation, the athlete may be denied entry to the event or disqualified during the competition or after its event.
6. Bringing intoxicants, illegal performance-enhancing substances, and alcohol to the event venue is prohibited. Athletes are prohibited from taking such substances both before and during the event, under the threat of exclusion. In the event that a athlete is found to violate this prohibition, the organizer reserves the right to deny them participation in the event or exclude them during the event.
7. The organizer provides emergency medical care on the course and at the finish line.
8. Each athlete is required to place the race number on the front, at chest height, under the penalty of disqualification.
9. The reverse side of the race number will contain a table that each athlete should fill out for easier identification in case of an accident. The table includes information about taken medications, possible allergies, and a phone number of a person the organizer should contact in case of an accident.
10. The organizer is not responsible for items lost during the event.

11. The organizer reserves the right to change the name of the event.
12. The binding and final interpretation of this regulation belongs solely to the organizer of the event. If any provision of the regulation is partially or entirely changed, all other provisions remain valid.
13. Matters not covered by the regulation are decided by the organizer based on applicable legal regulations. The above does not limit the right to legal action in the event of a dispute.
14. None of the points in the Rules exclude the organiser's responsibility that comes from the mandatory provisions of law.

XV. REGULATIONS RELATED TO FORCE MAJEURE

1. In the event of cancellation due to a pandemic or other state of threat or emergency, as well as due to factors beyond the organizer's control (so-called "force majeure"), the athlete will receive a voucher, equivalent to the paid entry fee, to be used for event held in the following year, or the participant will have the option to receive the entry fee within the timeframe specified by the organizer.
2. In the event of a change in the event date due to a pandemic or other state of threat or emergency, as well as due to factors beyond the organizer's control (so-called "force majeure"), the athlete will be transferred to the new competition date based on the agreement concluded with the organizer. The athlete will have the opportunity to apply for a refund of the entry fee within the timeframe specified by the organizer.
3. In the event of the cancellation or rescheduling of the event due to a pandemic or other state of threat or emergency, as well as due to factors beyond the organizer's control (so-called "force majeure"), money for purchased additional services will be refunded to the participant within 180 days. The purchased insurance is not subject to a refund.
4. Force majeure, within the meaning of these Regulations, encompasses all unforeseeable situations or events of an exceptional nature beyond the control of the organizer, preventing the fulfillment of any of the obligations specified in these Regulations, not resulting from the organizer's error or negligence, and remaining insurmountable despite exercising all due diligence, in particular: events of natural disasters such as floods, hurricanes, extraordinary force winds, tornadoes, earthquakes, exceptionally intense and prolonged downpours, or extraordinary and external events that could not be prevented (such as war, martial law restrictions, uprising, revolution, riots, terrorist attacks), epidemic threats, states of epidemic threat, epidemics, and states of epidemic, as well as new legal acts or decisions of administrative authorities preventing the Organizer from fulfilling its obligations. Neither the organizer nor the participants are liable for non-performance or improper performance of the provisions of these Regulations caused by force majeure.
